Welcome back! We hope you all enjoyed the half term break thank you to those of you who have shared photos on Tapestry the children have enjoyed sharing these this week. This half term the children will be exploring our wonderful world, growth and change. The children will learn about both flora and fauna linked to springtime. In maths the children will be exploring measures, this will encourage development of mathematical concepts and offer opportunity to use and extend their mathematical vocabulary. The children continue to develop their listening and attention skills, this half term our exploration of sounds will be rhythm and rhyme. We will regularly include rhyming books as part of the daily book-sharing session.



The children will explore several key texts including 'Lots of Frogs, 'The bad seed, 'Jack and the Beanstalk and 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar, which I am sure they will be recalling at home in no time. I wonder if you can find any of these at Bromsgrove Library, or even find a copy at home?

We will be celebrating World Book Day on Thursday 7th March. Instead of dressing as a favourite book character, we are inviting the children to decorate an item however they like, as long as it relates to a book they love. The idea is that you select an item such as a paper plate, pebble, wooden spoon.



Vaccination UK have been instructed by NHSE to administer the MMR vaccination to all school aged children who are outstanding one or both doses. The MMR would have been given at the age of 1 year and the second dose at 3 years and 4 months. There has been an outbreak of Measles in the West Midlands which have been on the rise within the last few weeks. If your child is outstanding one or both doses of the MMR, please contact their office on 01527 390030 to make an appointment.

There has been several confirmed cases of Chicken Pox in school this week. Chickenpox is common and mostly affects children, but you can get it at any age.
