The importance of children having the opportunity for outdoor and adventurous activities such as these can't be underestimated. Children get the chance to really get out of their comfort zones and that's where we know real learning happens. My sincerest thanks go to the staff team for giving up their time to ensure that the trip is such a success. I have no doubt that the children will have made memories for life.

Today, you will also be receiving a letter via email all about some funding that is available to schools called The Pupil Premium. For those of you that are unaware, Pupil premium is a government initiative

that qualifies your child to receive free school meals **throughout** their time at Meadows (not just for Reception, Year 1 & 2), but also enables the school to access further funding to support your child and other children in school.

At a time when school budgets are facing unprecedented pressure, I believe that we could be missing out on a possible £60,000 of unclaimed funding per year based on national averages. I would urge everyone reading this newsletter this week to please read my letter to see if your child could be eligible for the funding and claim. Pupil Premium funding makes a real difference to the offer we can make as a school.
