



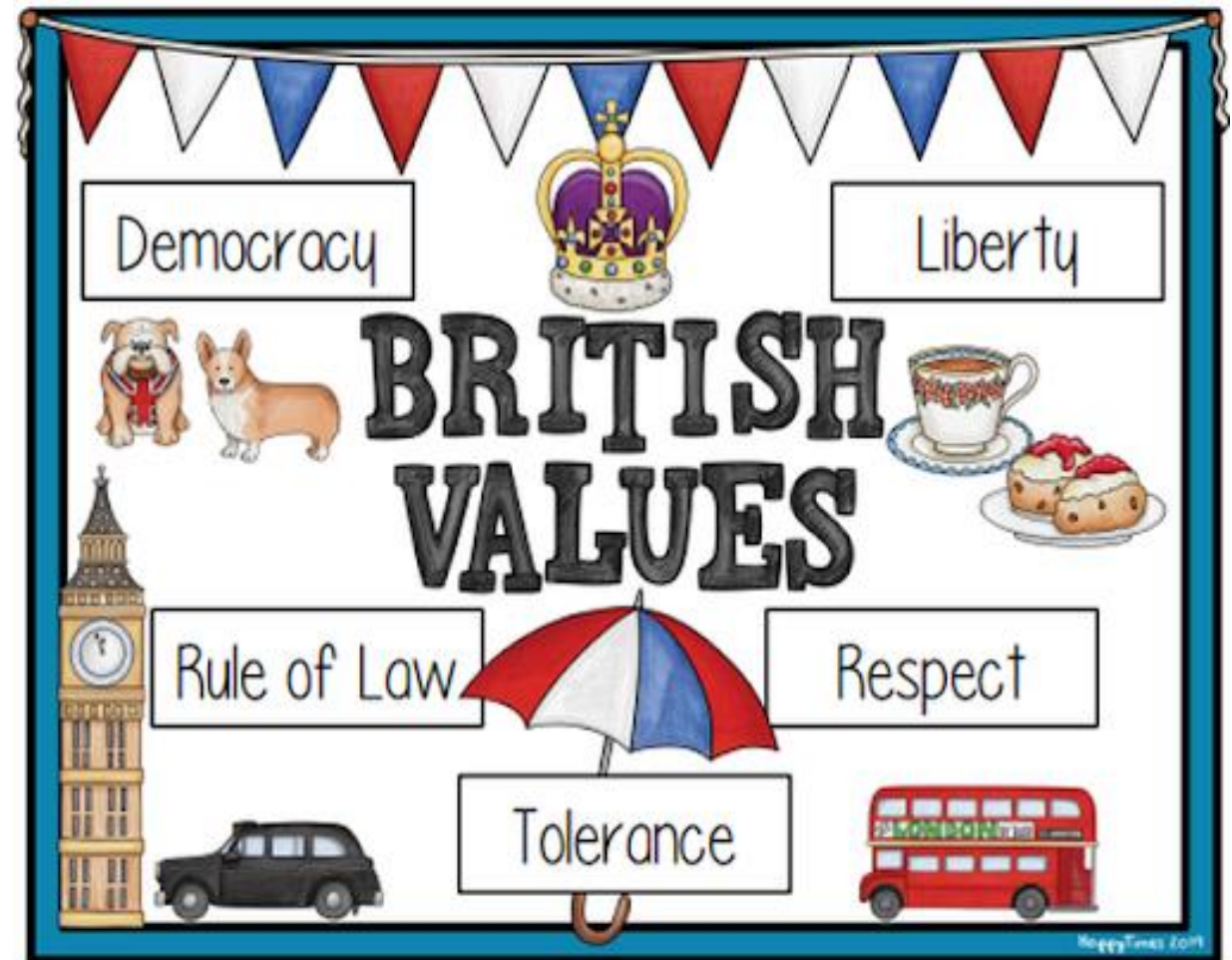
British Values

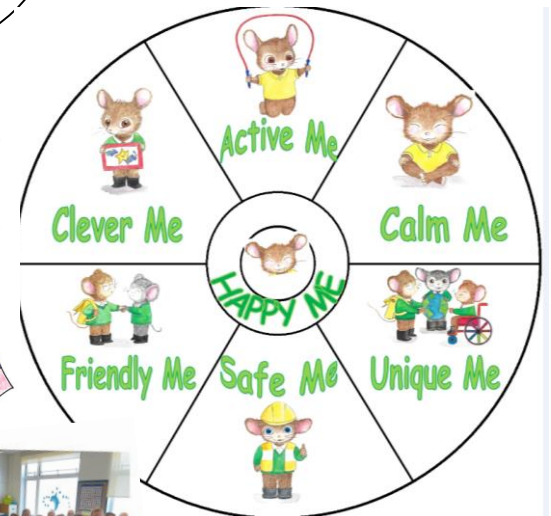

We looked at a PowerPoint shared by Elizabeth Stephens (Sandwell Council) about this issue and talked about starting a campaign. We came up with Slogans, information and a pledge for parents to sign and are going to blow up 150 balloons to show how much emissions are being released into the atmosphere every minute.

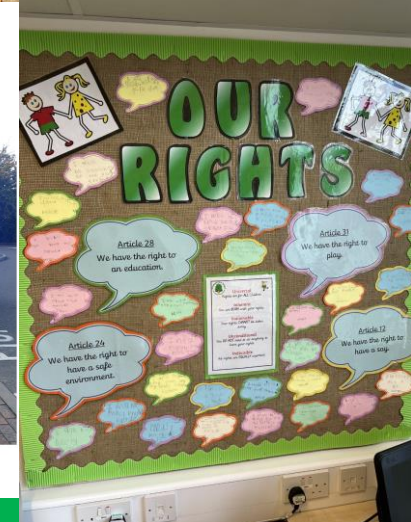
