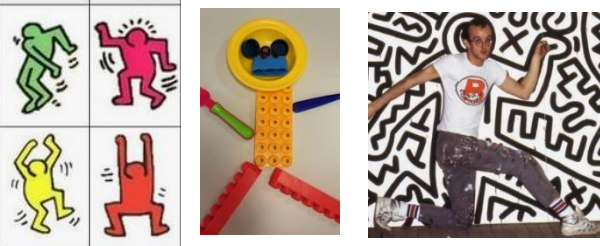

Explore different forms of sculpture – add papier mache to toilet rolls to build up a face – tribal Textile art African prints – explore wax and batik style printing on paper and fabric

sculpture	Making art in 3d form (something to touch/ walk around/ hold)
3d	Making out of clay/ papier mache to create a sculpture
bust	Sculpture of a face/ head
