Nursery Home Learning – Week 2 (30/3/20)

We have really enjoyed seeing photos and videos of the children on Tapestry. It is lovely to see so much fabulous home learning. We will continue to use Tapestry to post daily stories and activities and to provide links to any other ideas to support learning at home. A big thank you for continuing your child's learning at home during this period of school closure. It would be lovely to share any ideas you have with the others in our class too. Remember play is at the forefront of the Nursery Curriculum.

Maths - Rhyme time to five:

Explain to the children that you need their help with a number rhyme: Here is the beehive. Where are the bees? Hidden away where nobody sees. Watch and you'll see them come out of the hive. One, two, three, four, five... Bzzzzzzz! Help children to learn words and actions. Use prompts such as: Let's sing that line again. Join in with the words you remember. Who can show us the actions?

Routine:

Please work your home learning routine the way that suits you best, try to talk (or sing) about the days of the week and the weather.



Over the week I am going to set challenges around the colour Yellow to spread some sunshine – log into Tapestry for each daily challenge!

Letters and Sounds Rhythm and Rhyme

Rhyming soup: Ask your child to sit in a so they can see a selection of rhyming objects (e.g. rat, hat, cat) placed on the floor. Use a bowl and spoon as props to act out the song. Invite the children, to choose an object to put into the soup and place it in the bowl. After each turn, stir the soup and sing the following song to recite the growing list of things that end up in the soup.

Sing the first part of the song to the tune of 'Pop Goes the Weasel': I'm making lots of silly soup I'm making soup that's silly I'm going to cook it in the fridge To make it nice and chilly In goes... a fox... a box... some socks...


Miss Bailey will sing this and upload it to Tapestry too.






