




Our wonderful NHS workers are superheroes!  
What are the nurse and patient saying to each other?




Captain Tom Moore has raised over £29 million for NHS charities by walking 100 laps around his garden. If you could meet him, what would you say to each other?

# VE Day Art Ideas ...



Make a peg/ lollipop stick plane



Research some posters from WW2 and recreate your own (on the computer or using paint/ colours) To make the paper look old try dipping an old teabag onto it and dabbing it on the paper and then let it dry.



Make clay (or salt dough) medals – look at pictures of medals received during WW1/ WW2 and see if you can make them out of clay or salt dough (recipe;

- 4 cups all-purpose flour
- 1 cup salt
- 1.5 cups warm water
- Mix together well until pliable. Roll out thinly. Make some paper templates for the medals to cut around, or just use a small cup to make circular medals – don't forget to pierce a hole at the top in order to attach ribbon!

Bake for 2 hours on low heat (250F) or air dry for 2 days (depends on thickness). Then paint, varnish in glue.
