



The box game

The Activity

Put toys one at a time into a box, so children cannot see them inside, counting together. Ask: "Can you tell me how many are hidden?"

Add one or more to the box, without showing the objects inside, and ask "How many are there now?". Then show how many are inside the box and count to check.

Key questions

How many were there at the start?

How many are there now?

How do you know?

How did you work it out?

What if we add three more? What if we take two out?

Imagine there are 10 in there and I take out 6 – how would you know how many were left?




