

Monday	Which plants grow outside? https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/topics/zpxnyrd/articles/zw2y34j Have a look outside your window , in your garden or when you are on your walk. Today let's focus on the trees. Can you identify any of the trees? Have a look at the page following the planning and look to see if you can find any. Draw a picture of some of the trees you see or maybe you could make a tally chart? Perhaps you could label the parts of a tree? Use the sheet if you want to.	
Tuesday	Lots of you have been gardening whilst you have been at home. Did you plants seeds, bulbs or seedlings? THEY ARE AS PRETTY AS PRECIOUS GEMS.


SOME PLANTS GIVE US JUICY FRUIT,

SOON NEW STEMS AND LEAVES ARE SHOWING.


A Little Seed

Waiting to grow.




Out comes the sun,
