Geography in the Early Years involves guiding pupils to make sense of their world, through opportunities to explore, observe, and find out about people, places, technology, and the environment; noticing, and having time to recreate, simple patterns and processes in the world around them as they do so. They develop their early understanding of some of geography's key concepts, such as place, space, scale, environment, interconnections, and change;	Children will have frequent visits to Forest School, this will deepen their understanding of the natural world around them. It will allow children to have hands on experience about the changing seasons. They will explore maps by finding their own houses, searching for the countries they find out about and drawing their own maps (eg helping Father Christmas find Forest School) Through work on the theme "Around the World and Beyond" the children will look at environments around the world, looking at similarities and differences to their own experiences and how the life of children across the world contrasts to their own.
