

### Types of Media

Georgia O'Keefe enjoyed making pictures by enlarging (making bigger) the flowers she painted to make a better 'composition'. She also used different media to make her pictures.

**Observational art** – try to draw and look closely at real flower heads – enlarge them as you draw them. Build on drawing skills by making representations from life rather than imagination. Notice petals, stem, leaf shapes

Drawing – using pencils, charcoal, oil pastels – exploring a wide range of media

Children will learn how to blend colours using chalk pastels







Word/ term	definition
<b>Primary colours</b>	red yellow blue (cannot be mixed to make)
<b>Secondary colours</b>	are made using primary colours – orange/ purple/ green
<b>Observational art</b>	Drawing what you see by looking closely
<b>Oil pastels</b>	<b>Pastels made from an oil pigment children</b> to know that they can be used for colour
<b>Chalk pastels</b>	Are more crumbly in texture (like chalk) but good for blending

**Prior learning**

**Born in 1887, Georgia O'Keefe was an American artist** who painted nature in a way that showed how it made her feel. She is best known for her paintings of flowers.

Do you prefer the flowers painted by Van Gogh (Sunflowers) or O'Keefe? (children learn to talk comparatively and talk about own preferences, likes and dislikes)

Can you remember how we can mix paint to make green?

Children will have looked at Van Gogh's sunflowers – compare the work of Georgia O'Keefe to Van Gogh – children ask questions about the paintings

Recap primary colours and what happens when they are mixed together – can they recall how to make green, orange, purple?

Children will be building on their skills and techniques for drawing (from observation) and use of colour

Media – chalk pastels/ oil pastels
