# **Year 4 - Unit L2.5** Why do Christians call the day Jesus died 'Good Friday'?



## **Knowledge / Skills:**

#### Make sense of belief:


- Recognise the word 'Salvation', and that Christians believe Jesus came to 'save' or 'rescue' people, e.g. by showing them how to live
- Offer informed suggestions about what the events of Holy Week mean to Christians
- Give examples of what Christians say about the importance of the events of Holy Week

### Understand the impact:

- Make simple links between the Gospel accounts and how Christians mark the Easter events in their communities
- Describe how Christians show their beliefs about Jesus in worship in different ways

### Make connections:

 Raise thoughtful questions and suggest some answers about why Christians call the day Jesus died 'Good Friday', giving good reasons for their suggestions.

## What should I already know:

- Christians see Holy Week as the culmination of Jesus' earthly life, leading to his death and resurrection.
- The various events of Holy Week, such as the Last Supper, were important in showing the disciples what Jesus came to earth to do.
- Christians today trust that Jesus really did rise from the dead, and so is still alive today.
- Christians remember and celebrate Jesus' last week, death and resurrection.

Key Vocabulary:			
Christian	A person who believes in Christ		
Holy Week	In Christianity, this is the week just before Easter.		
Palm Sunday	the Sunday before Easter, on which Jesus entered Jerusalem, riding on a donkey.		
Good Friday	the Friday before Easter Sunday. The day in which Jesus was crucified on the cross.		
Easter Sunday	A day celebrated by Christians worldwide. The day in which Jesus rose from the dead.		
Sin	To commit an act or behavior which offends God.		
Salvation	Being saved from harm or ruin.		
Jesus	The son of God		
Crucifixion	Crucifixion is a method of punishment in which the victim is tied or nailed to a large wooden beam and left to hang, until they are exhausted or die.
