

| | Key Vocabulary | Definition |
|---|---------------------|--|
| | Improvise | To make up a tune and play it on the spot. |
| | Compose | To write or record sounds so that they can be played again in the same way. |
| | Listen and appraise | Listening carefully and considering different aspects of the music. |
| | Rhythm | A musical dimension that that describes the combination of long and short sounds to make patterns. |
| 1 | Tempo | A musical dimension that describes how fast or slowly the music is played. |
| | Structure | How the sections (verses and choruses etc.) of a song are ordered to make the whole piece. |
| | Texture | A musical dimension that describes the layers of sound in music. |
| | Dynamics | This is how loud or quiet the music is. |
